Aspirations For Life is being paid for by the Department For Children Schools and Families that's part of the Government.

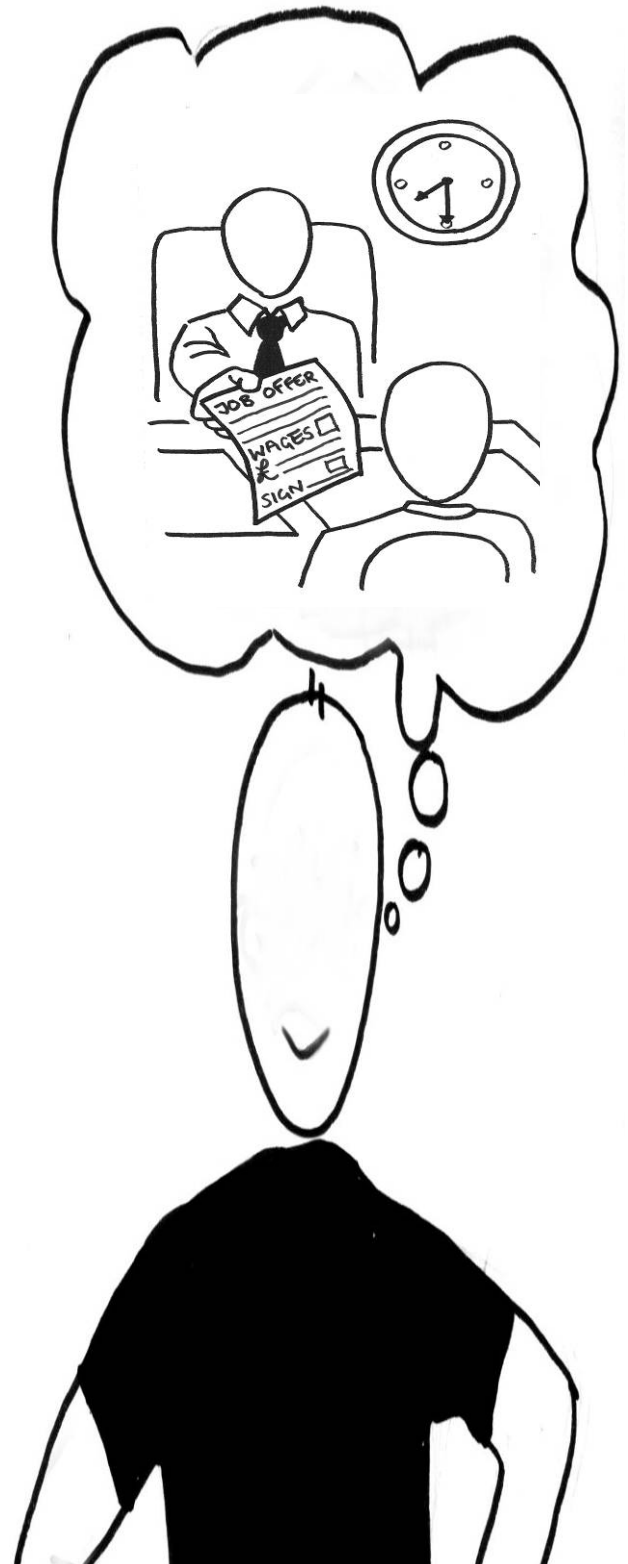


When **Aspirations For Life** is finished we are going to tell the Government about what we have done, and what people with learning disabilities want.
